

WTO Tariff and Trade Data (TTD) User's Guide

[Updated on 12 January 2026]

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1 INTRODUCTION

The Tariff & Trade Data (TTD) platform provides official tariff and import data for more than 150 economies, including annual data from 1996 onwards for many of them. It aggregates and disseminates official information about applied tariffs and import data notified by WTO Members in the WTO's Integrated Data Base (IDB) and bound duties (agreed maximum tariffs) and other commitments recorded in the WTO's Consolidated Tariff Schedules (CTS) database.

This information is complemented with information from the WTO Analytical Database (ADB), which integrates data from WTO sources, including Regional Trade Agreements (RTA), as well as data from external partners such as the International Trade Centre (ITC), UN Comtrade, and Trade Data Monitor (TDM). The ADB serves as the main source for platform statistics and is also available for download in raw format.

Tariff & Trade Data is currently in its beta version. As a result, some functionalities and pages may evolve, and additional features will be introduced over time. For questions or feedback, please contact us at ttd@wto.org.

This User Guide provides instructions on how to use each module of the platform. The TTD user interface offers simple navigation and intuitive selections. While most options are self-explanatory, this guide aims to assist users in handling more complex selections, understanding the results, and exploring the relationships between different sets of information.

The rest of this User Guide is organized according to the structure of the menu of the platform.

2 CONCEPTS AND METHODOLOGY

2.1 Tariff terminology or Tariff definitions

1. **Tariff line** refers to the most detailed product classification level in a member's tariff schedule, beyond the HS standard subheadings (6-digits), at which a customs duty is applied.
2. **Tariff Schedule**: An official list of tariff rates applied to all products at the tariff line level.
3. **MFN (most-favoured-nation) tariff**: Normal non-discriminatory tariff charged on imports (excludes preferential tariffs under free trade agreements and other schemes or tariffs charged inside quotas). They are based on HS tariff schedules notified by WTO members annually.
4. **Bound tariffs**: Maximum duty level on a product listed in a member's schedule of commitments; it represents the commitment not to exceed the duty applied on the concerned product beyond the level bound in the schedule. Once a rate of duty is bound, it may not be raised without compensating the affected parties.

4.1 Base duty: The duty rate used as the base rate in the most recent negotiations.

4.2 Initial Negotiating Right (INR): This is the result of initial bilateral negotiations between members. Members holding INRs are entitled to participate in renegotiations with a member requesting a modification of its tariff concessions.

5. **Preferential tariffs** encompass the non-reciprocal tariffs under the WTO transparency mechanism scheme as well as the tariffs applied in the context of regional or bilateral free trade agreements
6. **Other tariffs** are the tariff rates that are not covered by the WTO frameworks
 - 6.1- General tariff** is the standard (often higher) tariff rate applied to imports from non-preferred trading partners, those that do not benefit from WTO Most-Favoured-Nation (MFN) status or from regional/free-trade agreements.
 - 6.2- Additional tariffs** are extra duties imposed on imported goods on top of all other applicable duties (General or MFN or preferential tariff rate)
7. **Tariff Rate Quota (TRQ)**: a system combining a lower tariff rate for imports within a quota and a higher rate for imports above the quota.
8. **Ad valorem tariff**: is a tariff expressed as a percentage of the value of the imported goods
9. **Non-ad valorem tariffs**:

A tariff that is not expressed as a percentage of the value. Can be “specific”, “compound”, “mixed” or some other form. These other forms can be determined by complex technical factors; for example, the duty can be based on the percentage content of the agricultural component (sugar, milk, alcohol content, etc.) or its strength (e.g. the degree of sweetness).

9.1- Specific Tariff: A tariff levied as an amount of currency per unit of quantity of the imported goods.

9.2- Compound/ Mixed Tariff: A tariff that combines both ad valorem and specific components.

10. Ad valorem equivalent (AVE): a specific or other non-ad-valorem duty that is converted to its percentage or ad valorem equivalent.

2.2 Tariff indicators

Tariff averages:

Tariff rates are averaged at the product-group level, using either simple or weighted averages.

2.2.1 MFN Applied – Simple Average:

The MFN applied tariff simple average is the unweighted average of Most-Favoured-Nation (MFN) applied ad valorem duty rates or ad valorem equivalents (AVEs) of non-ad valorem duty rates, in an economy’s tariff schedule. The calculation is carried out in two steps:

First, calculate the simple average at the aggregated HS six-digit product code level by averaging the MFN applied rates at the tariff-line level

$$TS_1 = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n T_i^{mf n}}{n}$$

Where:

- TS_1 = MFN simple average at HS sub-heading level
- T_i = MFN applied tariff rate for tariff line i
- n = number of tariff lines within the sub-heading i

Then, compute the overall MFN simple average by applying the average to the pre-calculated simple averages at the HS subheading level.

$$TS_2 = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^m TS_{1j}^{mf n}}{m}$$

Where:

- TS_2 = MFN simple average
- TS_{1j} = MFN simple average at HS sub-heading j
- m = total number of HS-subheadings

2.2.2 MFN Applied - Weighted average

The MFN applied weighted average tariff represents the tariff average applied by an economy to imports from other WTO members, weighted by the import value of each product. This measure reflects the relative importance of each product in an economy's trade.

$$T_w = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^m (T_{S1j}^{mf n} \times M_j)}{\sum_{j=1}^m M_j}$$

Where:

- T_w = Tariff weighted average
- T_{S1j} = MFN simple average at HS sub-heading j
- M_j = Value of imports at HS sub-heading j
- m = total number of HS-subheadings

2.2.3 Effectively applied tariff_weighted average

The effectively applied tariff is the tariff rate an economy imposes on another, reflecting the applied tariff rate available under MFN treatment, preferential tariffs (assuming full utilisation), and additional tariffs. It is calculated by weighting the actual tariff rate applied by the import values of each product and origin pairing.

$$T_e = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^m (T_{e_j} \times M_j)}{\sum_{j=1}^m M_j}$$

Where:

- T_{e_j} = Effectively applied tariff rate for HS subheading j, which is the actual tariff rate applied among MFN, preferential, and additional tariffs.
- M_j = value of imports under HS sub-heading j
- m = total number of sub-headings

2.2.4 Maximum duty rate:

maximum rate, ad valorem duty or AVE, at tariff line level.

2.2.5 Share of MFN Duty free

The proportion of duty-free HS six-digit subheadings in the total number of subheadings in the product group. Partially duty-free subheadings are considered on a pro-rata basis.

2.2.6 Share of non-ad valorem tariffs:

Share of HS 6-digit subject to non-ad valorem duties.

When only part of the HS six-digit subheading is subject to non-ad valorem duties the percentage share of these tariff lines is used.

2.2.7 Tariff peaks:

relatively high tariffs applied on certain products. There are two definitions:

- International definition: tariffs of 15 per cent and above are measured by the share of HS six-digit subheadings subject to *ad valorem* duties or AVEs greater than 15 per cent. In the World tariff profiles publication, when only part of the HS six-digit subheading is covered by such duties, the calculation is done on a *pro rata* basis.

- National definition: tariffs higher than three times the average are measured by the share of HS six-digit subheadings subject to *ad valorem* duties or AVEs greater than three times the national average.

In the World tariff profiles publication, when only part of the HS six-digit subheading is covered by such duties, the calculation is done on a *pro rata* basis.

2.2.8 Simple average bound:

Simple average of final bound duties excluding unbound tariff lines.

2.2.9 Bound duty free:

Share of duty-free HS six-digit subheadings in the total number of subheadings in the product group. In the world tariff profiles publication, partially duty-free subheadings are taken into account on a *pro rata* basis.

2.2.10 Binding coverage:

is the percentage of a member's tariff lines that are bound in the WTO schedule of concessions List. It is measured by the share of HS six-digit subheadings containing at least one bound tariff line.

2.3 Methodology applied in the calculation of tariff indicators

2.3.1 WTO Tariff & Trade Data (TTD) (<https://ttd.wto.org/en>)

The Tariff & Trade Data (TTD) platform provides official tariff and import information for over 150 economies, compiling applied tariffs from the WTO's Integrated Data Base (IDB) and bound duties from the Consolidated Tariff Schedules (CTS). It also incorporates data from the WTO Analytical Database (ADB), which combines WTO sources and external datasets, including IDB, CTS, RTA, ITC, UN Comtrade, and Trade Data Monitor.

The ADB integrates tariff and trade data using consistent HS nomenclature and several complementary sources. For tariffs, it compiles MFN applied, preferential, and bound rates at the HS subheading level, primarily from the IDB, CTS, and RTA databases, with gaps filled using ITC data using the World Tariff Profile dataset. Tariff line data are converted into subheading averages, and HS versions are aligned through concordance tables. The database also provides the most favourable preferential rates available.

For trade, the ADB incorporates imports and exports by HS subheading and partner, using IDB, Comtrade, and TDM sources. It aggregates totals, excludes re-imports, groups unspecified partners, and applies "adjusted" correlation tables when nomenclatures differ to ensure consistency and better reflect world trade patterns.

Pre-aggregated tariff and trade dataset

- In the Profiles and Reports sections of the TTD, all tariff lines are first pre-aggregated to the HS subheading level, except for the maximum duty. For tariffs, simple averages of the tariff-line rates are applied, while for trade, the traded values of the tariff lines within each subheading are summed.
- Tariff calculations cover HS Chapters 01–97 and exclude in-quota rates. While Chapter 99 products are included in total trade values, they are not considered in trade-weighted averages.

- Calculations on bound tariffs are based on the WTO Member's approved schedule of concessions.

Ad-valorem equivalents (AVEs):

Ad-valorem equivalents are calculated at the most detailed level whenever possible.

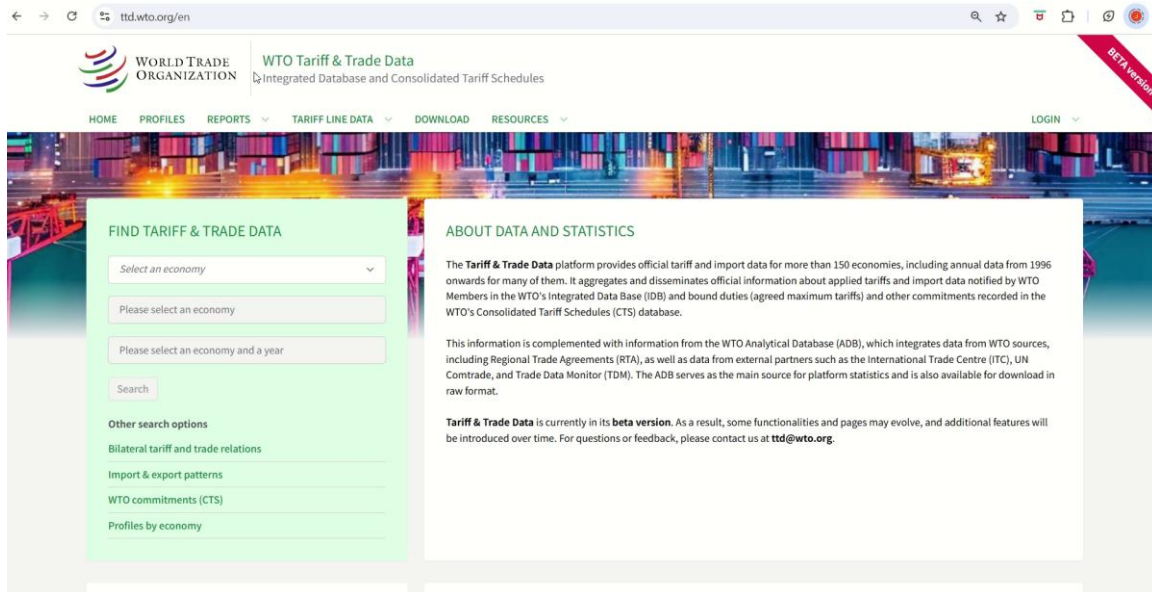
- For mixed duties the percentage part is selected and treated as the AVE, for example: "25\$/Kg but not more than 30%" would become "30%". For the specific duties (example: 37 Fr./ 100 kg brut) and compound ones (example: 8.3% + 21.05 EUR/100 Kg/net), the AVE is calculated using Unit Values.
- Unit values depend on the availability of imports data. In the case where national tariff line level imports (more detailed than 6-digit harmonized system codes) are available, they are used. If it's not the case then national imports aggregated to 6-digit code are used, and if this data is not available for specific economy, then world 6-digit imports will be used. To summarise: National TL level imports > 6-digit National imports > 6-digit world imports.

European Union:

The composition of EU Members within the European Union as an economy varies across years, reflecting changes in EU membership over time.

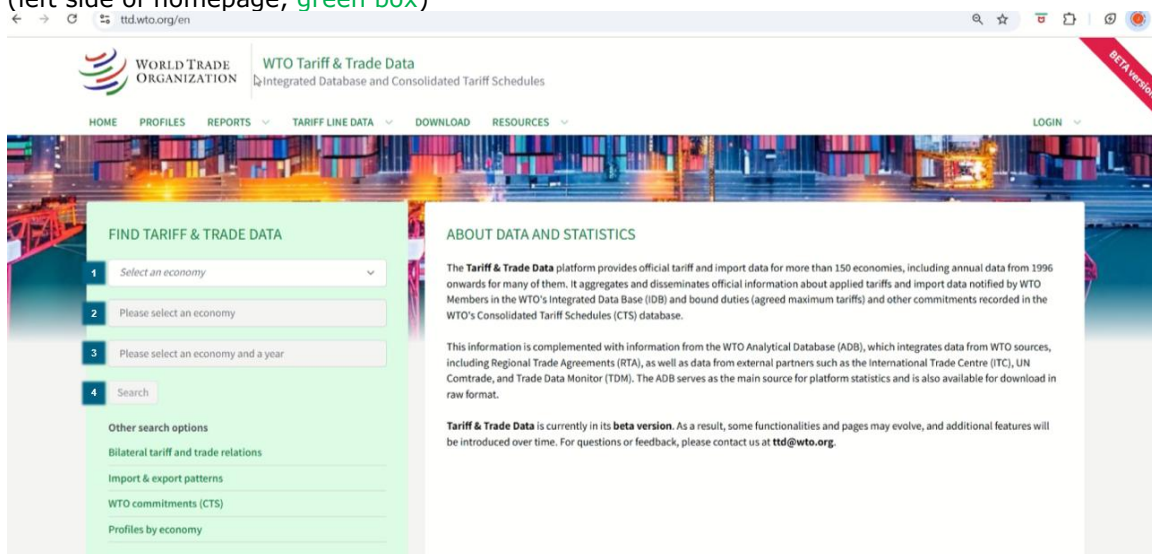

The **Home** page introduces the Tariff Trade Data Tool. From here, users can access all major features via the **top menu bar** or **left side quick access**.

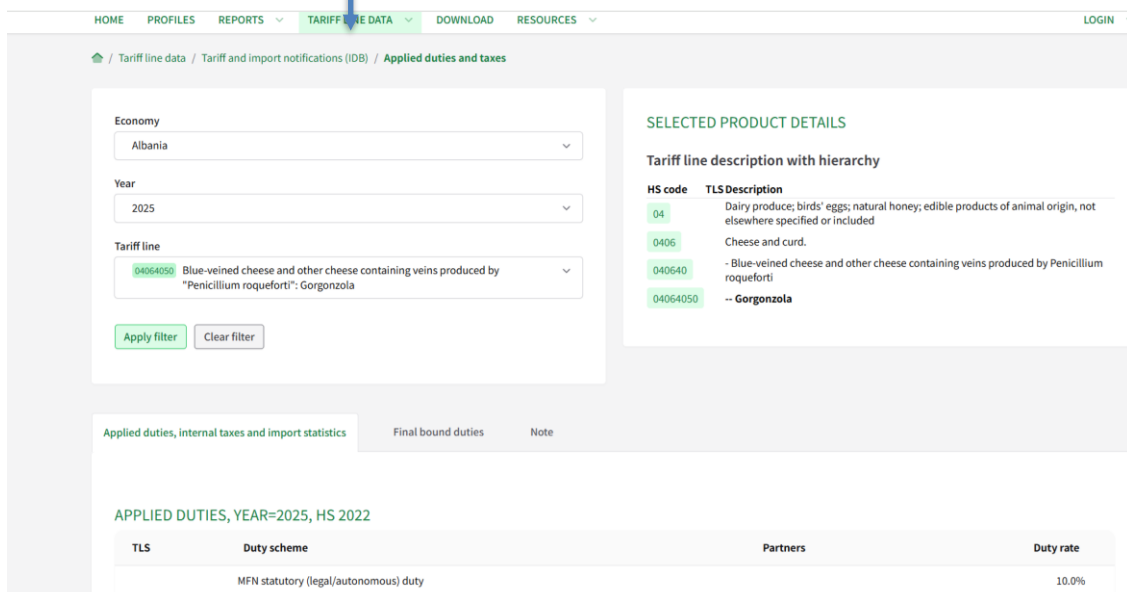
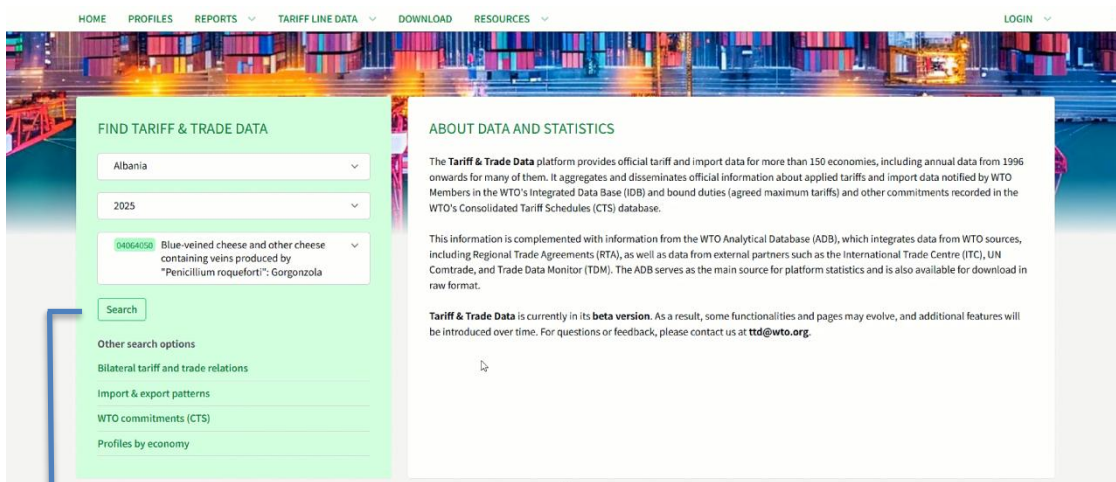
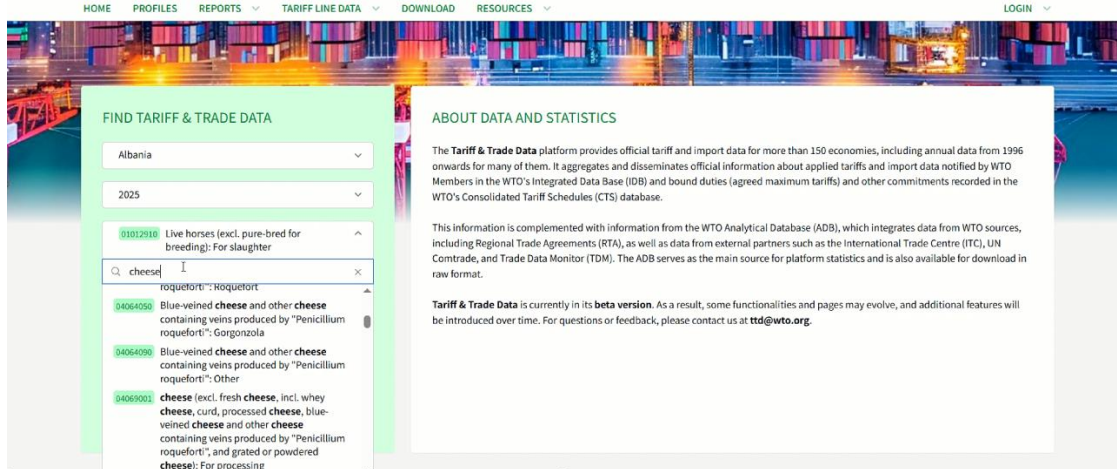
Quick Access Shortcuts (left side of homepage, green box)

This selection leads you to the page "Tariff Line Data > Applied Duties and Taxes."








The "Reports" section provides customized summary statistics that help users understand and analyse tariff and trade data. These reports allow users to:

Additional reports will be added to support analysis from different angles.

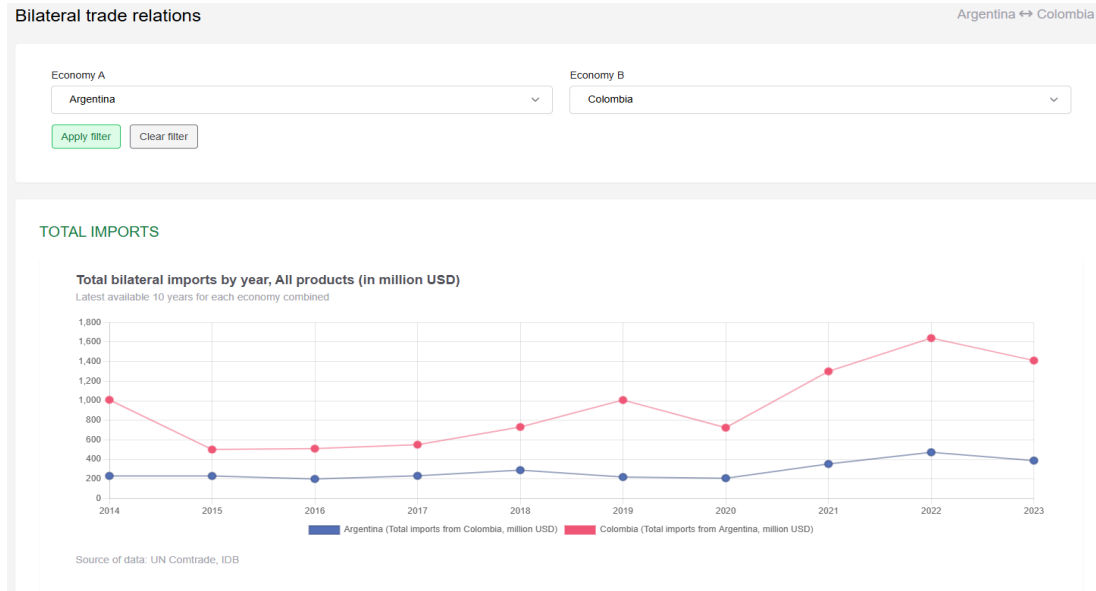
5.1 Bilateral tariff and trade relations

This report analyses the bilateral tariff treatment and trade flows between Economy A and Economy B. It presents import values for both economies, providing insights into their trade balance, product composition, applied tariffs, and preferential trade regimes.



To begin, select Economy A and Economy B from the selection panels, then Apply the filter. The results are organized into four sections:

Trade Trends: This section visualizes the evolution of trade values between the selected economies over the past ten years, highlighting overall trade trends and trade balance changes.



Trade Structure by Product: This section provides a breakdown of bilateral trade flows between Economy A and Economy B by MTN product groups for the most recent year with available data. To enhance understanding, the arrow in the image below highlights the trade direction.

The composition of EU Members within the European Union as an Economy varies across different years, reflecting changes in EU membership over time.

Customs offices record tariff and trade information according to the Harmonized System (HS). The HS is standardized up to six-digit level and customs offices generally have more detailed information, some national customs use 10- or 12-digit codes. In this report, except for the maximum duty, all statistics are first pre-aggregated to 6 digits; for tariffs the arithmetic average is calculated for each sub-heading while for imports the sum for the sub-heading is computed. Ad-valorem equivalents are calculated at the most detailed level whenever possible.

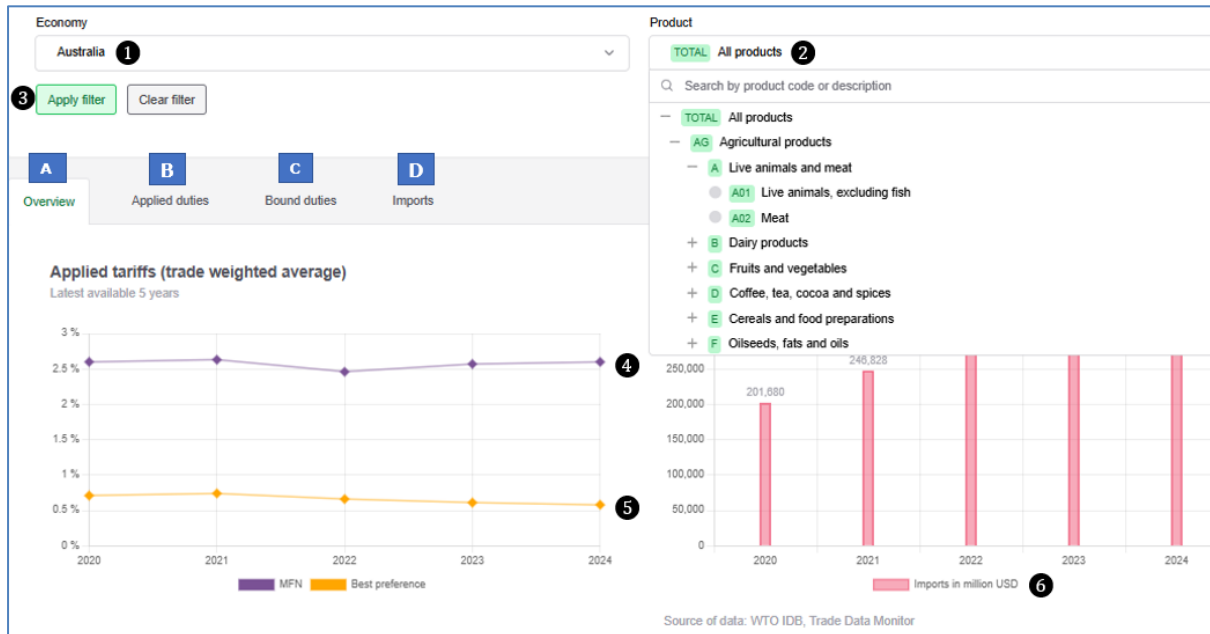
For this report, ❶ select a WTO Member in the drop-down window labelled as *Economy*, ❷ under *Product* choose a product group; once those two parameters are filled, the ❸ *Apply filter* button turns green and it is possible to click on the *Apply Filter* button. The product group can be changed for the same economy and the data will appear once one has clicked on the *Apply filter* button. If one wants to analyse a different economy, then one should first click on *Clear filter* and then select an *Economy*, followed by the desired *Product* and *Apply filter*.

A. Overview

This tab shows the ❹ trade weighted average of the MFN applied tariff and ❺ best preference for the latest available 5 years. The Best preference is the lowest duty from any preferential duty

schemes offered by the market under analysis to the imports from a country which is a beneficiary of that duty scheme; if no preferential scheme is available to the product from a country, then the MFN duty is relevant. The best preference is the trade-weighted average, assuming full utilization of the best preferential scheme(s) at the subheading level.

The product group Total (All products) for imports include Unspecified products; notice that unspecified products are excluded from trade weighted averages.



B. Applied duties

This tab provides information on the applied Most Favoured Nation (MFN) tariff and available preferential duty schemes across years. The user can:

- compare different duty schemes for one specific year; in that case the user will need to select one year in the drop-down window under *Year*,
- or analyse one specific duty scheme across years; in that case the user will need to select a *Duty scheme*

For all the available duty schemes, the simple average is provided; a * is listed next to the statistics whenever ad-valorem equivalents are used. In addition, for the MFN statutory duty, the trade weighted average based on imports from world and the maximum duty are available. All duty schemes for the available years can be downloaded in Excel format by clicking on *Download full data*.

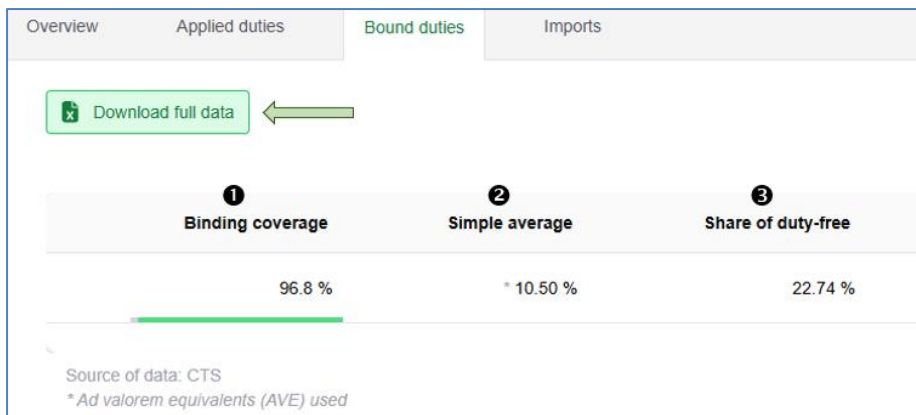
C. Bound duties

Under this tab, four different statistics are presented:

1. Binding coverage: share of sub-headings (6-digit HS code) in chapters 01 to 97 that are partially or fully bound.
2. Simple average: the arithmetic average of bound duties is first calculated at the sub-heading level and then aggregated at the level of the product group (all products, agricultural products or non-agricultural products).
3. Share of sub-headings that are fully duty-free; sub-headings containing both duty-free and dutiable commitments are dutiable at the sub-heading level. All the national tariff lines under a sub-heading should to be duty-free for the sub-heading to be considered as duty-free.

If AVEs are used in the calculation of the simple average or in determining the maximum duty, then a * will be listed next to the statistics. The maximum duty in the example below has a *; the 55% is part of a subheading where there are non-ad valorem duties and is not necessarily represent an AVE.





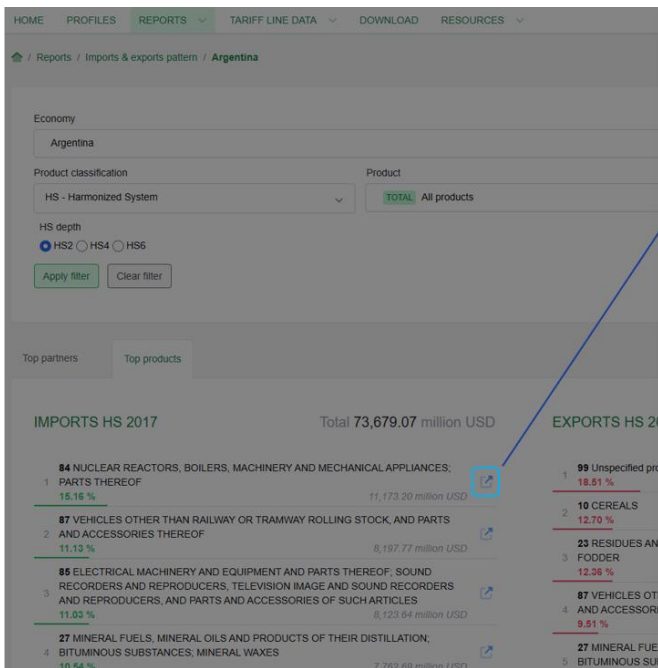

5.4 Tariff actions

The Tariff Actions dataset tracks changes to effectively applied tariff duties offering a detailed view of how import duties evolve over time. Effectively applied tariff rates are recorded at the tariff line level in the WTO's Integrated Database. These rates incorporate the Most Favoured Nation (MFN) applied duty and preferential tariff rates. Subsequently tariff actions are included, which may increase, decrease, or substitute a certain tariff level.

WTO – IMF TARIFF TRACKER

The WTO-IMF Tariff Tracker is a joint transparency initiative developed by the World Trade Organization (WTO) and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to monitor and visualize changes in effectively applied import duties. Drawing on data from the WTO's Integrated Database and WTO's Analytical Database, the tracker records tariff actions at the tariff line level, covering Most Favoured Nation (MFN) applied rates, preferential tariff rates granted under preferential duty arrangements, and any subsequent modifications—whether increases, reductions, or substitutions.

These tariff actions are aggregated to the 6-digit level of the Harmonized System (HS) and further classified under the Multilateral Trade Negotiations (MTN) product structure, offering a two-tiered categorization across 22 main categories and 72 sub-categories. The WTO-IMF Tariff Tracker presents these developments at both bilateral and product-specific levels, along with the relevant implementation dates. The data is also aggregated at the GTAP product categories. All datasets can be downloaded, the general Terms of Use apply.

It is important to note that in a context of rapidly evolving trade policy, some tariff actions may be announced without full technical specifications, especially when it comes to product coverage and eligibility. In such cases, the WTO-IMF Tariff Tracker reflects only those provisions for which reliable and verifiable information is available. Where necessary, clearly documented methodological assumptions are used to preserve analytical coherence—without implying any official interpretation by the WTO or the IMF.

Regarding recent bilateral trade deals or arrangements, the WTO-IMF Tariff Tracker includes only those that have been publicly confirmed by both parties and where the terms appear mutually aligned. In cases where an arrangement is only partially documented, the Tracker reflects only those elements that are clearly established.

While every effort is made to ensure the accuracy and timeliness of the information provided, the WTO-IMF Tariff Tracker is intended solely for informational and analytical purposes. Its contents do not constitute legal documentation and should not be construed as an endorsement or legal characterization of any tariff action by the WTO or the IMF. 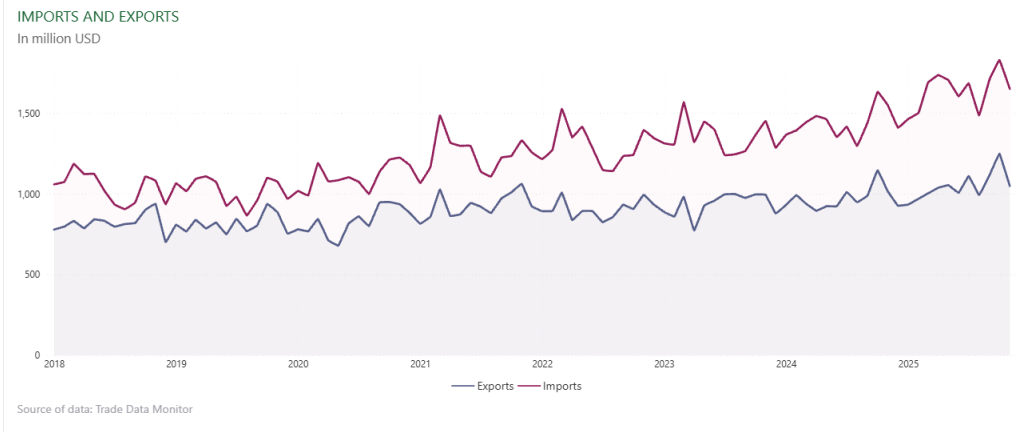

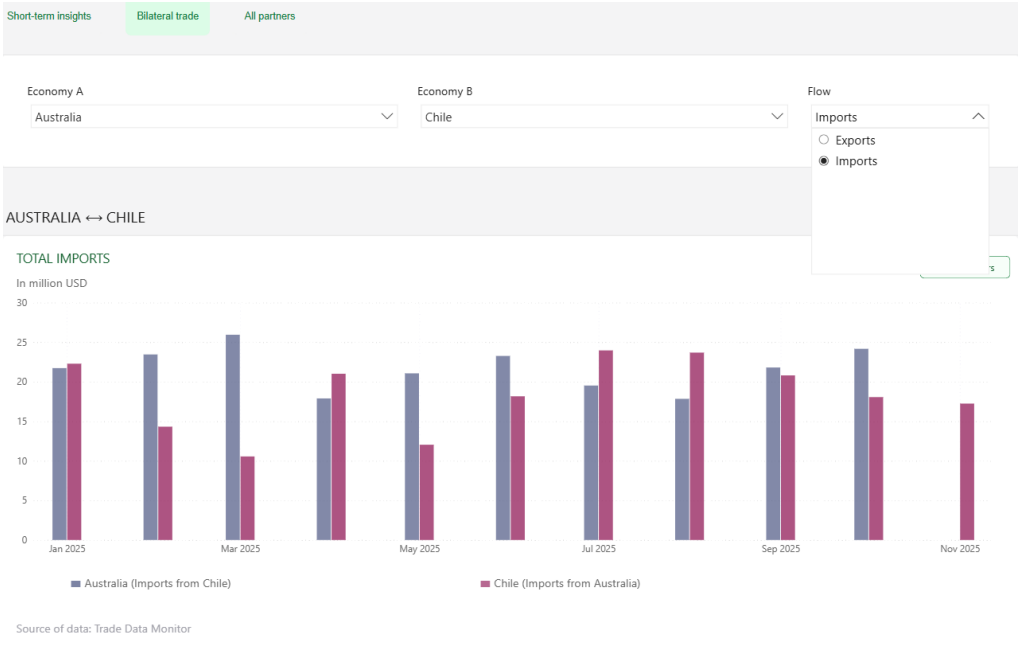

6 TARIFF LINE DATA

6.1 WTO Commitments (CTS)

The WTO Commitments (CTS) section provides an online version of a Member's Schedule of concessions on goods. However, this version does not have legal status and is not an exact reproduction of the official Schedule of concessions.

An introduction to the CTS, an overview of Members' Schedules, and a Glossary of key terminology used in the CTS database are available on the homepage of this section.

WTO COMMITMENTS (CTS)

WTO Schedules of concessions, often referred to as "Good Schedules" are legal instruments that describe the treatment a member must provide to the trade in goods of other WTO members.

The WTO Consolidated Tariff Schedules (CTS) database contains all WTO members' concessions on goods in a standardized format. The CTS includes members' bound tariff commitments (base and final tariffs, other duties and charges, implementation periods, INRs) and specific agricultural commitments (domestic support, export subsidies, and tariff quota information) with the relevant legal document references. The original version of the CTS database was recorded in the HS 1996 nomenclature, but most members' commitments have now been successively transposed to HS 2002, HS 2007, HS 2012, and HS 2017 nomenclatures.

The CTS database is readily accessible to WTO members, the public and authorized international organizations at the tariff line level. The WTO Secretariat has prepared several software tools to facilitate extracting and analysing information from the database.

GLOSSARY

Tariff line or HS code: The customs tariff line number (or HS code) associated with the product for which a concession is offered. Each entry in the database will have a number associated with it (including HS and tariff headings).

TLS: Refers to tariff line suffix which extends a narrowly defined tariff line's HS code to record two or more duties at different levels.

Final bound duty: The duty rate of the latest concession.

Other duties and charges: Other duties and charges applicable to the tariff line, which can consist of ad valorem and specific elements or textual information.

Present instrument: The WTO legal instrument in which the present concession on the product was established (e.g. UR/94).

First instrument: If available, the WTO/GATT legal instrument in which the first concession on the product was established (e.g. G/47, T/51).

Base duty: The duty rate used as the base rate in the most recent negotiations.

Special safeguard (SSG): An indication that the special safeguard provision is applicable to the tariff line or HS code (applicable only for agricultural products).

Implementation period (from): The start year of the first tariff reduction.

Implementation period (to): The end year when the final concession is implemented.

To generate information for a specific economy, select an economy and click the Apply Filter button. In the example below, Afghanistan is selected.



GLOSSARY

Integrated Database (IDB): WTO database of applied tariffs and imports.

Harmonized System (HS): An international nomenclature developed by the World Customs Organization (WCO), which is arranged in six-digit codes allowing all participating economies to classify traded goods on a common basis. Beyond the six-digit level, economies are free to introduce national distinctions for tariffs and many other purposes.

Developed by the WCO, it is organized in a hierarchical structure:

- Section
- Chapter (2 digits)
- Headings (4 digits)
- Sub-headings (6 digits)

Tariff line: The customs tariff line number (or HS code) associated with the product for which a concession is offered. Each entry in the database will have a number associated with it (including HS and tariff headings).

TLS: Refers to tariff line suffix which extends a narrowly defined tariff line's HS code to record two or more duties at different levels.

MFN (most-favoured-nation) tariff: Normal non-discriminatory tariff charged on imports (excludes preferential tariffs under free trade agreements and other schemes or tariffs charged within quotas).


8.3 Reference tables – nomenclature, product group

The 'HS Tracker' lets users track product code changes across HS versions. It is especially useful for comparing older and newer data sets.




